

Worker Cooperatives in Wisconsin

Wisconsin is home to 32 worker cooperatives that provide services in a wide range of industries. Here are some examples of cooperative start-ups and conversions.

Northwind Solar ★

Northwind Solar is a solar power system design and installation company founded in 2007 in Amherst, WI. In 2016, UWCC provided technical assistance to transition to a worker-owned cooperative. Throughout the 9 month conversion, UWCC provided governance and organizational support.

Cooperative Veterinary Care ★

Spring Green and Mazomanie Animal Hospitals provided veterinary care in the river valley community for over 20 years. The clinics were owned by three local veterinarians who were nearing retirement. Concerned about continuity of care, quality jobs, and their local economy, they determined that cooperative conversion aligned with their values and sold the clinics to their employees.

Union Cab

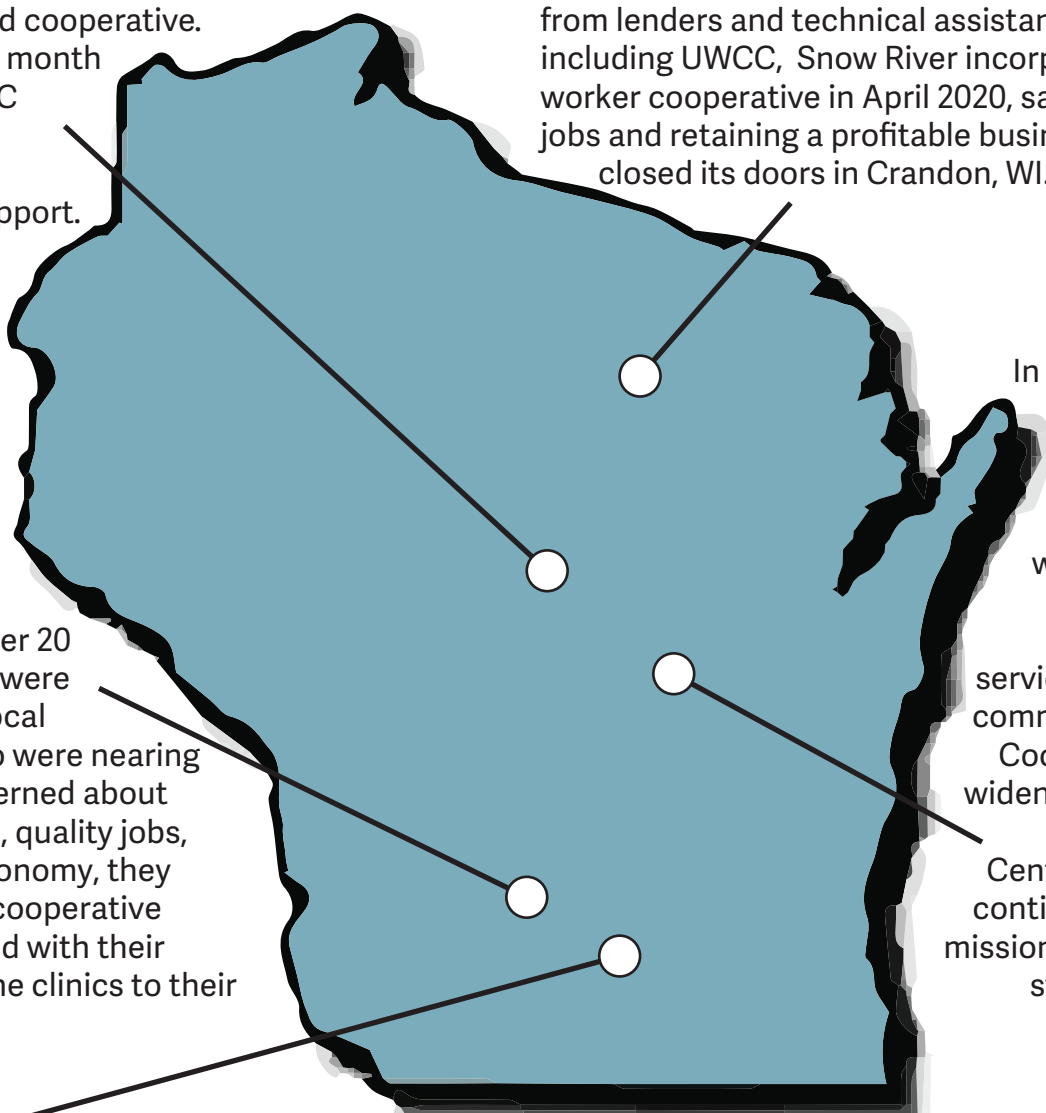
Union Cab of Madison Cooperative is a worker-owned cooperative providing taxi and transportation services in the city of Madison, WI. Union Cab was organized after several cab companies in Madison went on strike in the late 1970s. Since then, it has grown to be Madison's largest taxi fleet providing 400,000 rides annually.

Snow River Cooperative ★

When the owner of Columbian Home Products was ready to retire, the employees of this small wood product manufacturing plant connected with their union to explore employee ownership. With support from lenders and technical assistance providers including UWCC, Snow River incorporated as a worker cooperative in April 2020, saving eight union jobs and retaining a profitable business that nearly closed its doors in Crandon, WI.

Cooperative Care

In 2001, caregivers in Waushara County formed Cooperative Care to provide better wages and benefits to workers while offering superior service to people in the community. Since then, Cooperative Care has widened its service area throughout Central Wisconsin and continues to expand its mission of helping people stay in their homes.



A **worker cooperative** is a values-driven business owned and controlled by its workers that puts worker and community benefit at the core of its purpose. In contrast to traditional companies, worker members at worker cooperatives participate in the profits, oversight, and often management of the enterprise using democratic practices.
